## **Updates from Junior Woody**

- Junior shared that Ken Howle cannot be here today because he has tested positive for COVID.
- The grounds team is at work sprucing up the grounds for the fall season.
- NCDOT update. The entrance at the Welcome Center (stoplight installation) work should begin the week after Thanksgiving. Crosswalks also at the same time.
- Terrace will be closed week of November 17 for maintenance.
- Sunday brunch is returning on October 19 at the York Dining Hall.

Guest Speaker—Andrea Robbins, director of marketing and communications, for regional hospitals, spoke briefly and introduced the guest speaker, Dr. Allison Johnson, Haywood Regional Hospital, a surgeon and chief of staff. Dr. Johnson presented a slide show on cancer care at Haywood Regional Medical Center. Breast cancer is most common in women; prostate cancer in men. Second for both women and men is lung cancer. Third is colon for both genders. The death rates for cancers are highest with lung cancer, followed by breast, prostate, and colon. Steady decline in breast cancer and colorectal deaths since 1990; targeted treatments have been developed for these. At Haywood, breast, prostate, colon, skin, bladder are treated. 5 pillars of treatment: surgery, radiotherapy, chemotherapy, targeted therapy (hormonal), immunotherapy (Keytruda, e.g.). She went into detail about breast cancer, colon cancer, and skin cancer treatments. Screening is available for breast, prostate, and colon cancers. She recommended annual mammograms and PSA; prostate exam annually if family history; colonoscopy every 5-10 years depending on presence of polyps. Routine dermatology exams if sun damage or family history. For smokers, annual CT scan for lung cancer. Consider genetic testing if significant family history of cancer. She took several questions.
