ARTIST IN RESIDENCE

Lake Junaluska's artists in residence will hold an **art show**, art market and silent auction Labor Day weekend at Lake Junaluska. The Chapel's Silent Story: A Veteran's Search for Meaning

For over 65 years, the meaning behind the symbols embedded in the stained-glass windows of Memorial Chapel at Lake Junaluska remained a mystery. Built as a tribute to the men and women who served in the United States military during World War II, Memorial Chapel is the only chapel in the country with these unique symbolic images.


This special program will reveal the origins and meanings of these symbols—crafted by a young artist who emigrated from Ukraine.

The presenter, John Hooper, is a veteran of the United States Air Force and the Georgia Air National Guard. During his military service, he was stationed in Japan, South Korea, the Philippines, and the Panama Canal Zone.

As a veteran, John holds Memorial Chapel close to his heart. It took him more than five years to uncover the meaning of the symbols and the story of the artist behind them. Since then, the chapel has become a sacred and reverent place in his life.

Good News for the Future of Lake Junaluska

While some come to Lake Junaluska to walk and others to kayak, some to gather together and others to spend time alone with God, the lake is the center of all that happens here. Preserving and enhancing the lake and grounds so that more people will recognize the natural beauty of God's creation is the first aspiration of the Lake Junaluska Strategic Vision that many of you helped shape in 2020.

We are committed to being good stewards of the lake by preserving the dam and the shoreline that surrounds it. By providing a safe, clean and beautiful lake, Lake Junaluska will continue to be a God-inspired, awe-inducing place of Christian hospitality for decades to come.

We are pleased to announce that Lake Junaluska recently received a \$100,000 Emergency and Disaster Response Fund grant from The Community Foundation of Western North Carolina. This grant will fund the installation of a custom-designed debris boom at the Richland Creek inlet, replacing one damaged by Hurricane Helene. This boom is essential for capturing debris during future high-water events and preserving the lake's health and usability.

We are currently working with engineers to determine the optimal placement for the new boom, ensuring it both protects the lake and supports recreational activities.

This project is one of several that are currently being researched to preserve the lake for the next 100+ years. As we move forward, we need your support. We are pleased to announce that we have two generous donors who have offered to match all gifts to the preservation of the dam. Thanks to these generous matching gifts, every donation made between now and the end of the year will be matched dollar for dollar up to \$100,000, doubling your impact in protecting the lake and dam for future generations.
