UPDATE: CLEAN FISHING CAMPAIGN

The Clean Fishing Campaign Task Force wants to thank The Junaluskans and the Lake Junaluska Staff for their support during their first spring/summer campaign. The Campaign began at Haywood Community College's Fishing Day in April where we were able to share our Fishing Cards and tin weights with the 40 family units participating in the event. Throughout the summer a dozen volunteers circled the Lake distributing Clean Fishing Cards and samples of tin weights. We had many positive conversations with our fishing guests and enjoyed extending to them the hospitality of Lake Junaluska. Erika Nelson at The Bethea Welcome Center was a marvelous advocate for our work distributing fishing maps, Clean Fishing Rack Cards, and free tin weights.

In addition, we placed containers for the Clean Fishing Cards on the two Reel-In and Recycle Collection Stations at the Lake. At the suggestion of a local fisherman, we worked with Mike Huber to place two additional Reel-In & Recycle Stations around the Lake.
