On Friday, September 6, the **Junaluskan's Travel Group** will journey to the **Nantahala Outdoor Center**, **Stecoah Valley Cultural Arts Center**, **Fontana Dam** and Visitor's Center (highest dam east of the Rockies) and the Fontana Marina. Expect great water views of the Nantahala River and Lake Fontana and learn the history of the dam's construction and of the nearby area.

The early lunch choice for many will be the Big Wesser Riverside Pub (sandwiches and salads with outdoor seating). The other option is NOC's excellent River's End Restaurant (full menu) or a picnic you bring. Before lunch you might enjoy the outfitters store which not only features camping and water sports items but also interesting gifts. And the bridge you walk across the river on is the Appalachian Trail!

The Visitors Center at the Dam tells the history of its construction and details engineering features of the dam with videos and displays. Docents are retired TVA employees. Those that are interested can reserve a spot on the Historic Lake Tour from the Marina at 4p for \$40 but you should call NOW for reservations: 828-498-2017.

We'll all visit the Marina for a close-up view of the lake and ways to enjoy it. Some may choose an early supper at the Fontana Village Resort's restaurants, at the snack bar at the Marina or at one of the many restaurants in Bryson City on the way back home (which would mean four lane roads after dark).



New Pickleball Courts Coming Soon

In a world that values frantic busyness, Lake Junaluska stands apart. During the strategic visioning process, one of the things we heard from you was the need to uphold and strengthen the Lake Junaluska tradition of implementing innovative shared experiences for both individuals and families that celebrate faith, recreation, the arts and education. Our recreation area is one of the important ways we live into this aspiration, by providing a safe gathering space for families, friends and visitors to play together. This area has recently seen improvements in the form of new shuffleboard, bocce ball and cornhole areas and a new walking path. Thanks to \$290,000 grant from а generous Haywood County, the next phase of enhancements will be the construction of six state-of-the-art pickleball courts and the renovation of existing restrooms.

Construction for this project is scheduled to start on Tuesday, Sep 3 and should take approximately 12 weeks to complete. The new courts will be located where the upper two tennis courts are currently located, immediately adjacent to Memory Lane and beside the shuffleboard court area. The completion date could be delayed due to weather and temperature. During the initial phase of construction, the fence will be removed and temporary fencing will be placed around the construction area. We do not anticipate any road closures and only temporary impacts to vehicular and pedestrian traffic. The lower tennis courts, rear pickleball courts, and parking lot will remain open during construction.

The proposed timeline for the project is:

- Week 1 (September 3): Upper front courts closed; demolition of fencing begins.
- Week 2: Concrete curbing construction underway, with necessary cure time.
- Week 3: Existing cracks filled; installation of a 4" gravel base compacted.
- Week 4: Asphalt scheduled for installation; expect heavy equipment and asphalt odors during this phase.
- Weeks 5-7: Asphalt curing before painting; new fence and net posts installation. Area closed to the public, including geese.
- Weeks 8-9: Weather permitting, paint coats applied.
- Weeks 10-11: Final fencing and construction completed.
- Week 12: Grand Opening (Tentative)

The addition of these courts not only enhances recreational opportunities for residents and visitors but also helps us fulfill our mission to be a place of Christian hospitality where lives are transformed through renewal of soul, mind and body.
